### Legal Status

### Policy Aims

#### 1. Introduction

TILT Education is committed to providing an inclusive and supportive learning environment for all pupils, including those for whom English is an additional language (EAL). Our aim is to ensure that EAL pupils can access the full curriculum and achieve their academic potential while also developing their English language skills.

#### 2. Objectives

- To support EAL pupils in developing their English language proficiency.
- To ensure that EAL pupils can fully access and participate in the curriculum.
- To promote an inclusive school culture that values linguistic and cultural diversity.
- To provide EAL pupils with opportunities to develop both social and academic language skills.
- To involve parents and guardians in the education of their EAL children.

#### 3. Identification and Assessment

- **Initial Identification:** All new pupils will complete a language background questionnaire upon enrolment to identify those who speak a language other than English at home.
- **Assessment:** EAL pupils will be assessed using standardised English language proficiency tests to determine their current level of English. Ongoing assessments will be conducted to monitor progress.

#### 4. Provision

- **Curriculum Access:** EAL pupils will be provided with appropriate support to access the full curriculum. This includes differentiated instruction, use of visual aids, and bilingual resources where appropriate.

- **Individualised Support:** Based on assessment results, individual learning plans (ILPs) will be developed for EAL pupils. These plans will outline specific language learning goals and the support needed to achieve them.
- **Integration:** EAL pupils will be integrated into classes to promote language immersion and social inclusion.

## 5. Teaching and Learning Strategies

- **Differentiation:** Teachers will use differentiated instruction to cater to the varying levels of English proficiency in their classrooms.

## 9. Responsibilities

- **Head of Centre / Headteacher:** Responsible for overseeing the implementation of the EAL policy, coordinating assessments, and supporting staff.
- **Classroom Teachers:** Responsible for implementing EAL strategies in their classrooms and working collaboratively with the EAL coordinator.
